The 8 9 District must assign and admit a child who is homeless to a District school regardless of residence and irrespective of whether the homeless child is able to produce records normally required for 10 enrollment. The District may not require an out-of-District attendance agreement and tuition for a 11 homeless child. 12 13 14 Should a child become homeless over the course of the school year, the child must be able to remain 15 at the school of origin 16 The Homeless Liaison will review and revise as necessary rules or procedures that may be barriers to 17 enrollment of homeless children and youths. In reviewing and revising such procedures, the 18 19 Homeless Liaison will consider issues of transportation, immunization, residence, birth certificates, school records, and other documentation. 20 21 22 Homeless students will have access to services comparable those offered to other students, including but not limited to: 23 24 25 1. Transportation services: Educational services for which a student meets eligibility criteria (e.g., Title I); 2. 26 Educational programs for children with disabilities and limited English proficiency; 27 3. 28 4. Programs for gifted and talented students; and School nutrition program. 5. 29 30 31 The Homeless Liaison will give special attention to ensuring the enrollment and attendance of 32 homeless children and youths not currently attending school. The Board will appoint a liaison for homeless children. 33 34 A "homeless individual" is defined as provided in the McKinney Homeless Assistance Act. Anyone having a concern or complaint regarding placement or education of a homeless child will 35 36 first present it orally and informally to the District homeless liaison.
